

Level One MEFC Discipleship Questions: Facilitating Discovery In Bible Reading¹

Each time you read the Bible answer these questions. Writing down your answers will not only help you to remember what you read, but also enable you to discuss your answers, if you are meeting with someone else in an Iron Man/Woman team. Feel free to print multiple copies of this document, if it would help to use it as a journal.

1. What did you learn about God in the reading?

What did you learn about the gospel (God is King, we have sinned and don't want to submit to his reign, we are under his judgment, he sent his Son as the Savior, and we receive him by faith, and as a result follow him as King)?

2. What did you learn about yourself or about mankind in the reading?

3. What should you do about what you learned?

4. How will this shape my relationships with disciples? With Children? With Friends? With Co-workers? With the Church?

a. Those not believers, but who maybe are seekers (John 1:39 ["Come and See"]).

b. Those who are believers (John 1:43 ["Follow me"]).

c. Those who are workers (Mt. 4:19 ["Follow and...fishers..."]).

d. Those who are multipliers (John 15:16 ["bear much fruit"]).
